

## ‘Collaboration Compendium’

### Collaboration and Shared Services Stocktake – 14<sup>th</sup> May 2019

This document summarises services where authorities are either currently collaborating (column 3) and where authorities have identified areas where there is potential for future collaboration (column 2). The focus has been on service collaborations/joint services rather than other joint or regional activities such as partnerships, governance, planning or strategic arrangements.

Most of the ‘potential’ services identified for collaboration below (column 2) are taken from local authorities’ Green Paper consultation responses (2018) or White Paper consultation responses (2017 – indicated in *italics*). Most of the authorities’ responses however explicitly stated that collaboration must be underpinned by business cases and meet various ‘tests’.

It is proposed that this document is updated annually and expanded to incorporate collaborations with other public service organisations.<sup>1</sup>
